SCHOOL PROFILE:

Butler High School is a four-year comprehensive high school for grades nine through twelve with an enrollment of around 975 with 100 vocational students attending the Miami Valley Career Technology Center. The Butler school day consists of seven periods of fifty-two minutes each. Courses are for one or two semesters and credit is given at the end of each semester. To graduate, a student must accumulate twenty-two credits, including 4 credits of English, 4 credits of math, 3 credits of science, 3 credits social studies (to include World Studies, US Studies and Government), ½ credit of health, ½ credit of physical education, ½ credit of speech/communications or technology, ½ credit of financial literacy, and 1 credit in fine arts.

Seniors are ranked for all courses granted credit in grades nine through twelve. Final ranking, including determination of valedictorian and salutatorian, is based on completion of eight semesters. Grades of A, B, and C in honors classes (indicated by *) are weighted one point.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS:

Honors classes exist in several areas. An honors sequence in math begins with Algebra 1 in the seventh grade and ends with Advanced Placement Calculus. Beginning with the 2014-15 school year, high school credit will be awarded for Algebra I and Honors Geometry taken in middle school. These classes will not be included in the high school cumulative GPA. Advanced Placement English class is available in grade twelve, with designated honors English classes at grades nine, ten and eleven. Other Advanced Placement courses are offered in the areas of Art History, Biology, Chemistry, European History, French, Latin, Music Theory, Spanish and U.S. Government and Politics. Third year foreign language classes are designated as honors level programs. Butler also has comprehensive programs for developmentally handicapped and learning disabled students. Junior and senior students may also elect to attend any of approximately fifty vocational programs at the Miami Valley Career Technology Center. A grade of “P” in the course Physical Education Alternative indicates that the student has met the physical education requirement for graduation through athletics/marching band/color guard. (No credit is given for this course, nor is the grade used in the computation of GPAs.)

ACCREDITATION:

Butler High School is certified by the Ohio Department of Education.

COMMUNITY:

Butler High School is located in Vandalia, Ohio, which is ten miles north of Dayton. Vandalia is a suburban community of average and above-average income with some industry and several commercial shopping areas. Its proximity to Interstates 70 and 75 has earned the area its designation as the “Crossroads of America.” Vandalia-Butler City Schools serves the population of approximately 23,000 living in both Vandalia and Butler Township with two elementary buildings, two middle schools, and one high school.
